We are very excited to announce that Academy Skateboard Collective will be joining us on September 24, 25 and 26.

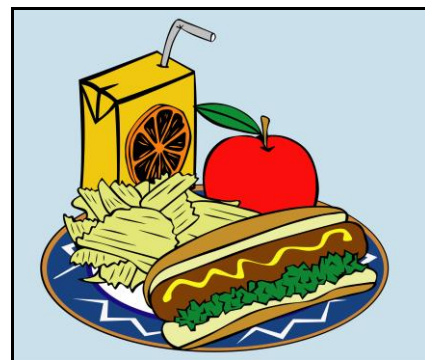

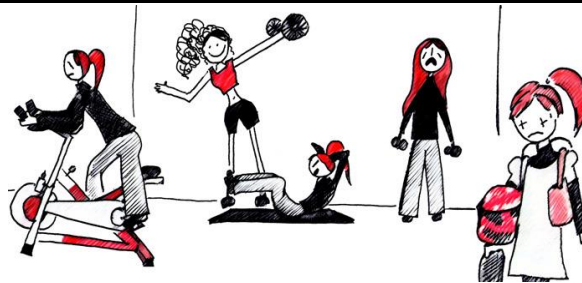

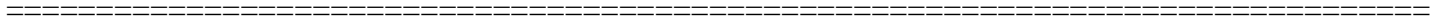
HOT LUNCH AND HOT DOG VOLUNTEERS NEEDED
