Modeling What Great Citizenship Truly Means


A Message from the Superintendent

Dear Parents:

<u>PowerSchool Parent Portal</u> is what we will be using to complete Alberta Education's requirements to digitize student records. There are many benefits to having a Parent Portal account such as viewing your child's grades (for select schools), attendance, and teacher comments, as well as being able to email your child's teacher directly. If you have multiple children, they will all be shown under one account.

If you didn't have an account we created one for you and your username and password were emailed to you.

When you log in for the first time you will be required to change your password. Please do this on a computer. If you want to change your username please contact Kathy at 403-749-3838.

When you have signed in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal <u>link</u> go to the bottom left side and <u>click</u> on next you will need to go to the top

right and click on the bell with the red number on it. This will then take you into the form to complete. If you have more than one child you will have to do a form for each. Please remember to hit submit after you have completed all five screens.
